



In 1885 the first imperial egg was created by Peter Carl Faberge as a special order to the Russian Emperor Alexander III who gifted it to his wife Maria Feodorovna for Easter. The Empress admired the egg immensely and this gave start to an annual extravagant tradition that was followed by Nicholas II.



The egg is an ageless symbol of new life and rebirth. Honoring the Resurrection, Christians decorated eggs and exchanged them with loved ones with the Paschal greeting "Christ is Risen!"

After The Russian Revolution, the imperial custom of giving eggs at Easter survived. The egg pendant was often added to a necklace containing other eggs received throughout the years creating a future family heirloom.
